Welcome to the team!

We are thrilled to welcome Jen Davies to the staff team. Jen is joining us as an Outreach Worker and will also be heading up the weekly group sessions (Living Room). She has a wealth of knowledge and experience and we are looking forward to seeing what fresh ideas she has for this group.

We spend **25** hours a month on the streets supporting & helping keep women safe through the Evening Outreach.

In 2018 there were over **350** contacts and we met **30** new women during the evening shifts.

During 2018 we supported approximately **50** women to access **1200** appointments. These were mainly drug, health, domestic abuse, housing and benefit related. **10** new women were referred to the daytime support team.

Meet a volunteer

Amanda has been volunteering with us for over 10 years. She brings a wealth of first hand experience to the team; who best to get alongside the women than someone who knows what they are going through and the challenges they face.

Amanda has always been keen on speaking out for the women and campaigning for them to have a voice. She is one of the authors in the book *An Untold Story* and has been a regular speaker at various events, conferences and also the radio.

Last year, Amanda joined AVA (Against Violence and Abuse) as a peer researcher to compile a research piece on the challenges facing survivors of violence against women and girls. The report 'Hand in Hand' was co-produced by 11 peer researchers who are survivors of domestic and/or sexual abuse. The report is based on their interviews with women facing 'multiple disadvantage' - who have experienced violence and abuse, and continue to face issues like homelessness, mental ill-health and substance use. It found most of the women, both peer researchers and interviewees, had experienced many forms of abuse throughout their life, which had wide-ranging effects. Amanda was quoted in the press release -

Peer researcher Amanda says: "Struggling with any disadvantage is really difficult. When those disadvantages are stacked upon each other it can be impossible to escape them.

Changing perspectives and challenging stigma is vital in creating the empathy society needs to truly support vulnerable women."

We are sure there is far more to come from Amanda and we hope that more women like her will join us in supporting women in Hull.
